Citizen wishes to change in whole or in part: Sec. 15-1-72 State of Wisconsin Electrical Licenses, Certifications and Definitions, Sec. 15-1-35 Plumbers to be Licensed, Sec. 15-1-60 Gas Licenses.

Intent of these changes is to give residential home owners the ability to do their own work as allowed by state law. It is not meant to be construed as limiting inspection or reducing or altering any other requirements.

Sec. 15-1-72 State of Wisconsin Electrical Licenses

1) General

No Person, firm, corporation, institution, organization or representative thereof shall engage in the installation, alteration, re-construction, extension or any work covered under the Scope of this Article or engage in business of said, installation, alteration, reconstruction, or extension for any purpose in the City of Onalaska without first having proper certifications licenses and insurance as provided by this Section and per Wisconsin State Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code as may be amended. A residential property owner may not install, repair or maintain electrical wiring on premises that the property owner owns and occupies as a residence; all work must be performed by an Electrical Contractor as defined in SPS 305.41.

2) **Writing in strikethrough is to be deleted:**

General

No Person, firm, corporation, institution, organization or representative thereof shall engage in the installation, alteration, re-construction, extension or any work covered under the Scope of this Article or engage in business of said, installation, alteration, reconstruction, or extension for any purpose in the City of Onalaska without first having proper certifications licenses and insurance as provided by this Section and per Wisconsin State Statutes and the Wisconsin Administrative Code as may be amended. A residential property owner may ~~not~~ install, repair or maintain electrical wiring on premises that the property owner owns and occupies as a residence(.) ~~all work must be performed by an Electrical Contractor as defined in SPS 305.41.~~

Sec. 15-1-35 Plumbers to be Licensed

Plumbers to be Licensed.

No person shall carry on the business of plumbing or do any plumbing work until he/she shall have first obtained the proper license to do so from the state. An unlicensed person may remove stoppages in drain pipes or repair valves or faucets. No person shall install plumbing unless at all times a licensed Wisconsin master plumber is in charge, who shall be responsible for the proper installation.

Changes in italics:

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Sec. 15-1-60 Gas Licenses.

(a)

License Required.

No person shall hereafter engage in the business or install, alter, repair or service gas burners or gas burner equipment as defined herein within the City of Onalaska without first securing from the Board of Gas Examiners a license. The requirements herein shall not be construed to limit the gas utility's right to render necessary service.

Changes in italics:

No person shall hereafter engage in the business or install, alter, repair or service gas burners or gas burner equipment as defined herein within the City of Onalaska without first securing from the Board of Gas Examiners a license *unless they are a property owner in a one-family building owned and occupied by him or her as his or her home or farm building.* The requirements herein shall not be construed to limit the gas utility's right to render necessary service.

Reasons these laws should be changed

1. **Wisconsin and Federal law** - It has been Wisconsin and Federal law to allow homeowners to do their own plumbing and electric for decades without any large scale impacts.
2. **Inspection regardless** - You have to pay for inspection anyway; the inspector should be there to make sure the work meets code. The law already states all work needs to be inspected while everything is open and when it's finished. There's really no getting around the fact that all work must meet code.
3. **Personal pride and self reliance** – it's my personal belief not only to save money but as a matter of personal pride and to make sure things are done correctly. I come from a generational family of home builders my dad built the first steel home in Globe Arizona and built his second home with over 8 thousand feet of wiring (that's about a mile and a half!) and with a little bit of help from the inspector everything up to code and working perfectly.
4. **Improve city revenue** – Paying someone 7 times the cost of materials cuts deeply into the budget for other renovations, additional renovations would improve the value of the property and thus increase city revenue.
5. **A different time we live in** - It's a completely different world that we live in when these rules were drafted. This was before the world wide web, we now have access to all of mankind's knowledge at our fingertips, combine this with other resources like do-it-yourself stores like home depot and there's very little a person with half a brain couldn't do.
6. **Cost** – No adequate quality or market control when you're forced to use someone else. The area electricians could collude and charge whatever they want for services if there's no market control for someone to be able to do their own work.
7. **Restrictions are a greater danger** - It incentivizes people to do their own work illegally which means it's not being inspected. On the other side of the coin out-dated and poorly installed wiring before we had things like building codes typically can be a larger safety risk than citizens doing it themselves. So it really doesn't protect any potential home buyers if shoddy work was done behind walls because of the overburdening costs of hiring someone else to do it.
8. **Past experience** – I was on city council in River Falls and not only did we not have these laws without any problems but we also removed nearly every mandatory inspection for rentals and homeowners. I thought this was a little over zealous and voted against it but still zero problems have occurred since.

This home is a real opportunity for me to work my way into the middle class with the sweat of my own brow but that's greatly deterred if I have to pay professionals 7 grand to do half a days worth of work. In my family if we do hire someone to do the work then we watch them and make sure everything is done right and if we are going to stand there watching them we might as well just be doing it ourselves. I would have liked to come with a stack of evidence on why it's not necessary but so few communities have these overburdening regulations that there's really no data to present and I guess in a way that's the best data of all, no absolutely none showing that removing these laws would endanger Onalaska citizens.

1.0 Background

The City of Onalaska requires our event to have an emergency plan defined, in order for our permit to be approved. Independent of this requirement, it is prudent to have a clear plan defined for race organizers to follow, in the event of emergency.

2.0 Emergency procedure

All race officials listed in section 5.0 will:

- Carry their cell phone with them (phone numbers listed in section 5.0)
- Be wearing a bright yellow shirt (different from course volunteers)

In the event of an emergency, follow this procedure upon arriving on scene of emergency:

- 1) Race official calls 911
- 2) Race official calls other members that make sense (i.e. call Bruce if CPR needed)
- 3) The police and fire department buildings are in close proximity.

- 4) We'll have an emergency vehicle identified so race official can drive to emergency scene.

3.0 Emergency supplies

- 1) EAD/CPR kit at finish line.
- 2) First aid kit (band aids, gauze, etc.) at finish line.

4.0 Severe weather plan

- 1) If there are storms/lightning in the area, a decision will be made at 6:30am to continue or cancel the event.
 - a. Bruce Martin and Tom Harron will make this decision and an email will be sent out (to all registered participants) and web-site home page will be updated communicating the cancellation.
 - b. We will have a person working the St. Patrick's office phone (608-783-5483) providing the status of the race.

(see other side)

- 2) If the event is not cancelled at 6:30 (for example, it is just sprinkling out), but dangerous (thunder/lightning) develops around 8am, we will:
 - a. Instruct all participants and volunteers to enter the gymnasium, including all course marshals, parking attendants, etc.
 - b. Bruce and Tom will refer to local radar and determine if race should be canceled or delayed (up to 15 minutes).
 - c. If delayed, we'll wait until weather conditions are good, give volunteers 10 minutes to get back to their posts, and start the race.
- 3) If the City of Onalaska "air raid" siren sounds (due to approaching tornado, or very severe storm), we will instruct all volunteers and participants to the St. Patrick's Church basement.
